### **Review Process**

Three Step Process

Step 1: Agency Determination

(Initial determination and public comment period)

<u>Step 2</u>: Rules Review Commission (RRC) Review (Reviews agency's report and makes final determination)

Step 3: Administrative Procedure Oversight (APO) Committee Consultation (Opportunity to review final determination before it becomes effective)



# Regulatory Review of 15A NCAC 02G

- Sections: Title of Rule (# of Rules)
  - .0100 State Participation in Water Resources Projects (12)
  - .0300 Beach Project Revolving Fund Advances (5)
  - .0400 Floodway Establishment (2)
  - .0500 Allocation of Jordan Lake Water Supply Storage (7)
  - .0600 Aquatic Weed Control (1)



### **Initial Determination**

- 15A NCAC 02G 27 rules
  - No rule <u>necessary with substantive public interest</u>
  - 20 rules <u>necessary without substantive public interest</u>
    - Sections .0100, .0500 & .0600
  - 7 rules <u>unnecessary</u>
    - Sections .0300 & .0400



### **Initial Determination**

- Rules listed as <u>necessary without substantive public interest</u>. We intend to make technical revisions later to update:
  - Names and references
  - Remove obsolete references
- Rules were deemed unnecessary because ....
  - The revolving fund cited never existed
  - It was repealed in 1984

## **Comments (Cont'd)**

#### Sections:

- .0500 Allocation of Jordan Lake Water Supply Storage
  - This rule is important and "necessary without substantive public interest" as defined in this rules review process. The Jordan Lake water supply storage is vitally important to the Triangle Region, the economic engine of North Carolina. It is important to have the objective, fact-based process for allocating that storage as provided by this rule.
- .0600 Aquatic Weed Control
  - Your list is a good one. It would be wonderful if the NCDA list added the plants from your "additional species" section to their list of Class B noxious weeds. The agencies need to be more coordinated in their efforts against these weed species. The lower southeast portion of the state has many issues with some of these plants, as they are able to overwinter quite well.
